themselves while at school as well as forming better future classroom working habits.
















TaiRoa

We have had a great start to the term with students showing they are ready to learn. They have already been very busy setting up for our financial literacy topic 'Destination New Zealand'. A topic that builds on Financial skills such as Budgeting, Planning, Research skills and including lots of reading. We had a fantastic turn out to the whanau interviews that was really appreciated. Our year 6's have the wonderful opportunity of going to the Auckland Zoo and staying a night at Kelly Tarltons, later this term. Last term, students were involved in working with clay and learned how to build a strong structure with it. They researched Primitive ovens used around the world and created a model of a chosen primitive oven. We touched on Green screening last term and will continue to integrate its use in the students' presentations.

We had introduced STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) activities last term and will continue to do so throughout the year. Students carry out an activity and write up a text following a Procedure structure in writing. Last term it was cooking and creating hair bands.
