This term in Tai Pari we have been focusing on the school value whanaungatanga, building relationships. Tai Pari students have been focused on personal identity by developing their connections of self to whānau, hapū and iwi through their pepeha and whakapapa. Students have also been developing strategies for relationships through Whanaungatanga Fridays, an idea suggested by the students and includes kai plus activities where students work together.

In keeping with the focus of building positive relationships Tai Pari students have been participating in physical activities such as Ki-o-Rahi offered by Sport Northland and run by Whaea Gina which was a new sport for some Tai Pari students and a great refresher for others. During the time with Whaea Gina this term Tai Pari students have learned some great team building and leadership skills.

Tēnā koutou whānau,

Wow time has gone quickly this term. Students have been settling into routines and working hard on their mahi. For the beginning of the term we focused on things that inspire our students, what motivates them to learn and tried to identify what we need to do to stay focused. We completed several pieces of Art works to decorate our room. However due to illness I have not been able to display their mahi as yet. (Coming).

We then moved on to knowing more about where we live in Aotearoa. Why do tourists want to visit the Far North? Students created google slides to highlight our beautiful area and what attractions we have. They also worked on a mini Financial Literacy project, searching for costs to attend the attractions, accommodation, food and travel costs etc. They were not impressed how a good sized budget did not go too far.

Tai Roa has started this term, during our daily rotations, using an online platform called **Education Perfect**. It is designed to make learning fun, engaging and effective. It blends engaging content and cutting edge teaching methods. What I particularly like is that it personalises the learning for each student by identifying those that might need revision, extension, or just lots of practice. A great additional tool to reinforce what I am teaching in the class in both reading and maths.

For maths we have introduced 'Do Now' where students for every maths session complete difficult maths mahi and then have the same type of mahi over several days. It has worked so well. Students by the third or fourth day are usually very quick at solving the problems or saying it's too easy.

For reading, students have been carrying out a Novel Study. This will continue into Term Two. Lots of reading and looking deeply into the texts.
